



Vintage Wallpaper Metal Embossed Tissue Box Cover

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Note: This tutorial was inspired by Diane Zechman's Tissue Box Tutorial. I wrote my own instructions and took my own pictures to create the box I had in mind using Metal Sheets.



Supplies List

- **Paper:** Early Espresso Cardstock (#119686), Bronzed God Metal Sheets (purchase at www.addalittledazzle.com)
- **Accessories:** Paper Cutter (#104152), Big Shot (#113439), Vintage Wallpaper Impressions Folder (#120175), Designer Frames Impressions Folder (#123130), Sticky Strip (#104294), Bone Folder (#102300), Extra-Large Oval Punch (#119859)
- **Non-Stampin' Up!:** Tissue Box (Kleenex Brand)

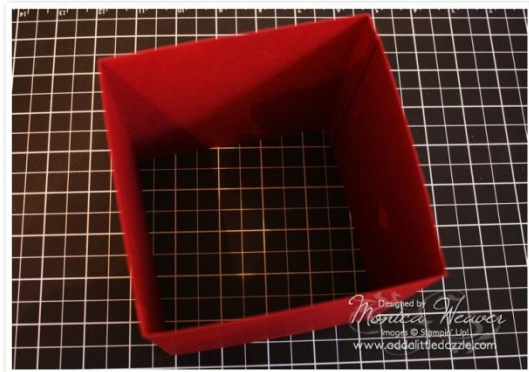
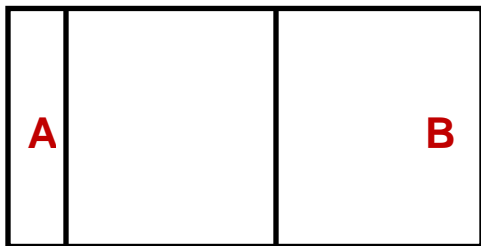
Dimensions:

- Early Espresso: 5 1/8" x 9 1/2" (2 pieces), 6 9/16" x 6 9/16" (1 piece), 3" x 4" (1 piece)
- Bronzed God Metal Sheet:
 - 4" x 4 1/4": (4 pieces-base layers)
 - 3/4" x 4 1/4": (4 pieces-lid side layers)
 - 4 1/4" x 4 1/4": (1 piece-top layer)
 - 3" x 4" (1 piece-opening)

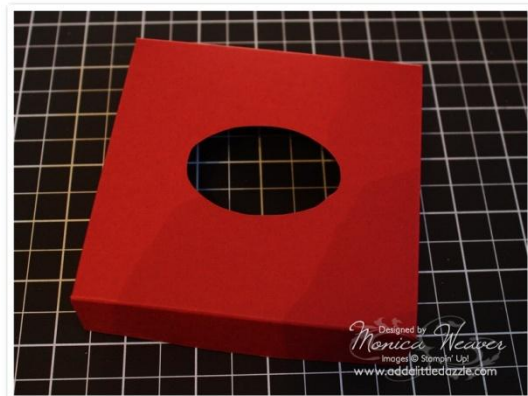
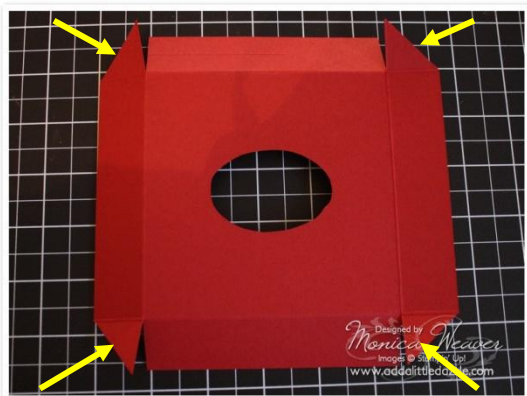
Note: You will need 1 1/3" metal sheets to create one Tissue Box Cover. You can create 3 Metal Sheet Embossed Tissue Box Covers with 4 Metal Sheets.

Instructions for Vintage Wallpaper Metal Embossed Tissue Box Cover:

1. Take the 5 1/8" x 9 1/2" pieces of cardstock, align the 9 1/2" side along the top of the Paper Cutter and score at 1/2" and 4 1/2". Follow this same step for both pieces. **Note: If you are using the Simply Scored Scoring Tool, you will score at 1/2" and 5".**
2. Place two pieces of Sticky Strip along Side A flap (both pieces). Peel the red film from Side A of one of the pieces and attach it to Side B of the second piece. Peel the red film off Side A of the second piece and attach it to Side B. You will have a box; this is your base. **Note: Cherry Cobbler cardstock was used to make the pieces more visible against the background.**



3. Take the 6 9/16" x 6 9/16" square and score all four sides at 1". Take your 3" x 4" piece of cardstock and use your Oval Punch to punch out an oval. Take the oval, place it in the center of the lid, trace it, and cut it out.
4. Take you square from Step 3 and cut the areas shown below. Place Sticky Strip on the flap and attach them to the wall that joins it. This will create your lid.



5. Place Sticky Strip along the inner lid of the tissue box, peel the red film, and attach it to the base of the tissue box holder.
6. Take the 4 ¼" x 4 ¼" piece of metal sheet, trace the oval in the center, and cut out the center. Emboss the piece and then place Sticky Strip along the four outer walls and around the oval. This will allow all areas to adhere completely.
7. Take all the metal sheet pieces and emboss them with the Impressions Folder.
8. Place Sticky Strip along the four walls of each of the metal embossed pieces and attach them to the corresponding sides of the tissue box.
9. Take the 3" x 4" piece of Metal Sheet and emboss it with the Designer Frames Impressions Folder. Take the Oval Punch and punch out the center and cut out the frame with your scissors.
10. Place Sticky Strip carefully around the ring of the frame, peel the red film, and attach to the center of the Tissue Box lid cover.
11. Slip finished Metal Embossed Tissue Box Cover over the tissue box.

Note: If you are going to sand your image, make sure to clean off residue with a Tissue Paper.
