Supplies List:

- Paper: Early Espresso Cardstock (#119686), Bronzed God Metal Sheets (purchase at <u>www.addalittledazzle.com</u>)
- Accessories: Paper Cutter (#104152), Big Shot Die-Cutting Machine (#113439), Silicone Rubber #114615), Standard Premium Crease Pad (#113476), Backgrounds 1 Texturz Plates (#114512), Sticky Strip (#104294), Snail Adhesive (#104332), Crop-a-Dile (#108362), Magnet Sheets (#119816), Metallic Brads (#119741)
- Non-SU: Mini Calendars, Acrylic Photo Frame 4" x 6"

Dimensions:

- Early Espresso Cardstock: 4" x 6" (1 piece), 2 ¹/₄" x 3 3/8" (1 piece), 3" x 3 ¹/₄" (12 pieces)
- Bronzed God Metal Sheet: 3 ³/₄" x 5 ³/₄" (1 piece)
- Picture: 2 ³/₄" x 3" (12 pictures)
- Magnet Sheets: 1" x 2" (13 pieces)

Directions for 2012 Metal Embossed Desktop Photo Calendar:

Step 1 Take the 3 ³/₄" x 5 ³/₄" piece of Bronzed God Metal Sheet, place it on top of the Texturz Plate (color side down), place the Silicone Rubber on top of the metal sheet, and place the Standard Premium Crease Pad on top of the Silicone Rubber. Afterwards, place the entire assembled piece on top of the closed Multipurpose Platform and run it through the Big Shot.

Step 2 Take the Metal Embossed piece from Step 1, place Sticky Strip along the back of the metal sheet piece, peel the red film, and attach to 4" x 6" piece of Early Espresso Cardstock. Place the assembled piece inside the 4" x 6" Acrylic Photo Frame.

Step 3 Use Snail Adhesive to attach the 2 ³/₄" x 3" pictures to the 3" x 3 ¹/₄" pieces of Early Espresso Cardstock. **Note: You will have 12 matted pictures.**

Step 4 Use the Crop-a-Dile to punch two holes through the calendar and run an Antique Brad through each hole. Place Sticky Strip along the back of the calendar, peel the red film, and attach to the $2\frac{1}{4}$ x $3\frac{3}{8}$ piece of Early Espresso Cardstock.

Step 5 Place Sticky Strip along the back of the piece assembled in Step 4, peel the red film, and attach to the lower section of the Acrylic Photo Frame.

Step 6 Take a 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2" piece of Magnet Sheet, peel the white film, and attach to the upper section of the Acrylic Photo Frame. Place a 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2" piece of Magnet Sheet to the back of each matted picture. Place the picture of choice to the upper section of the Acrylic Photo Frame and easily switch it out each month with your picture of choice.
